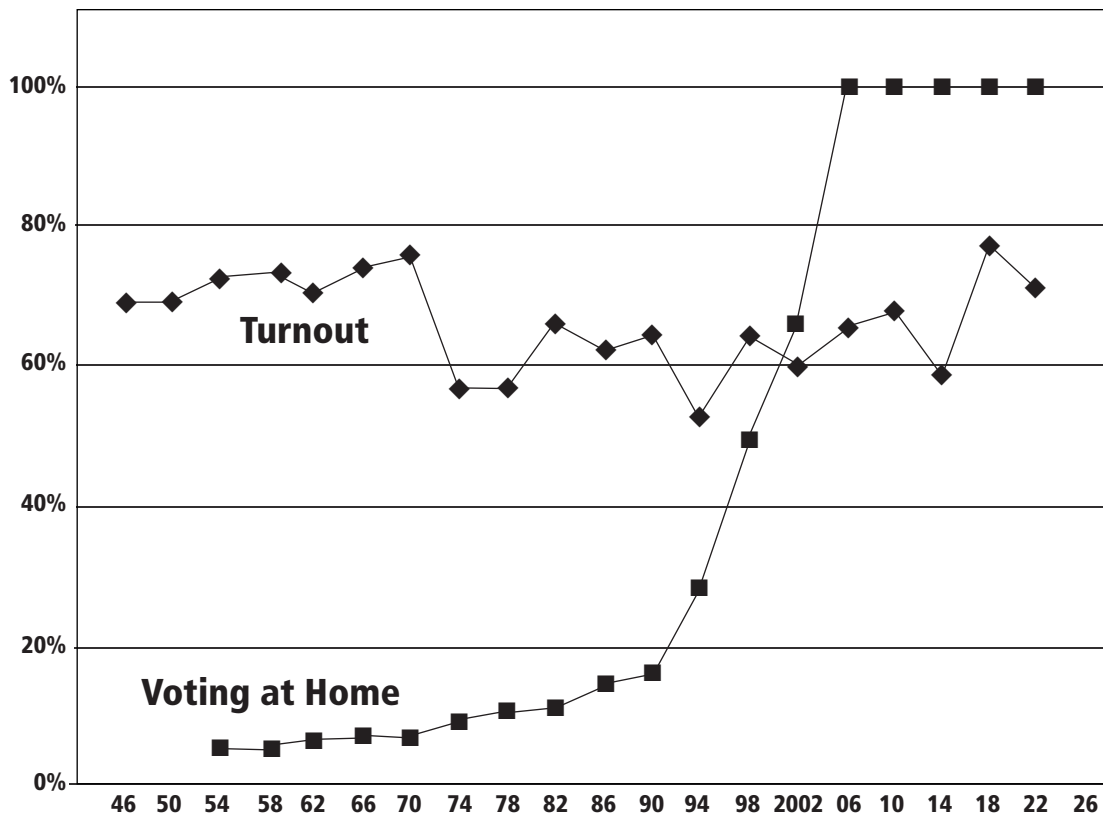

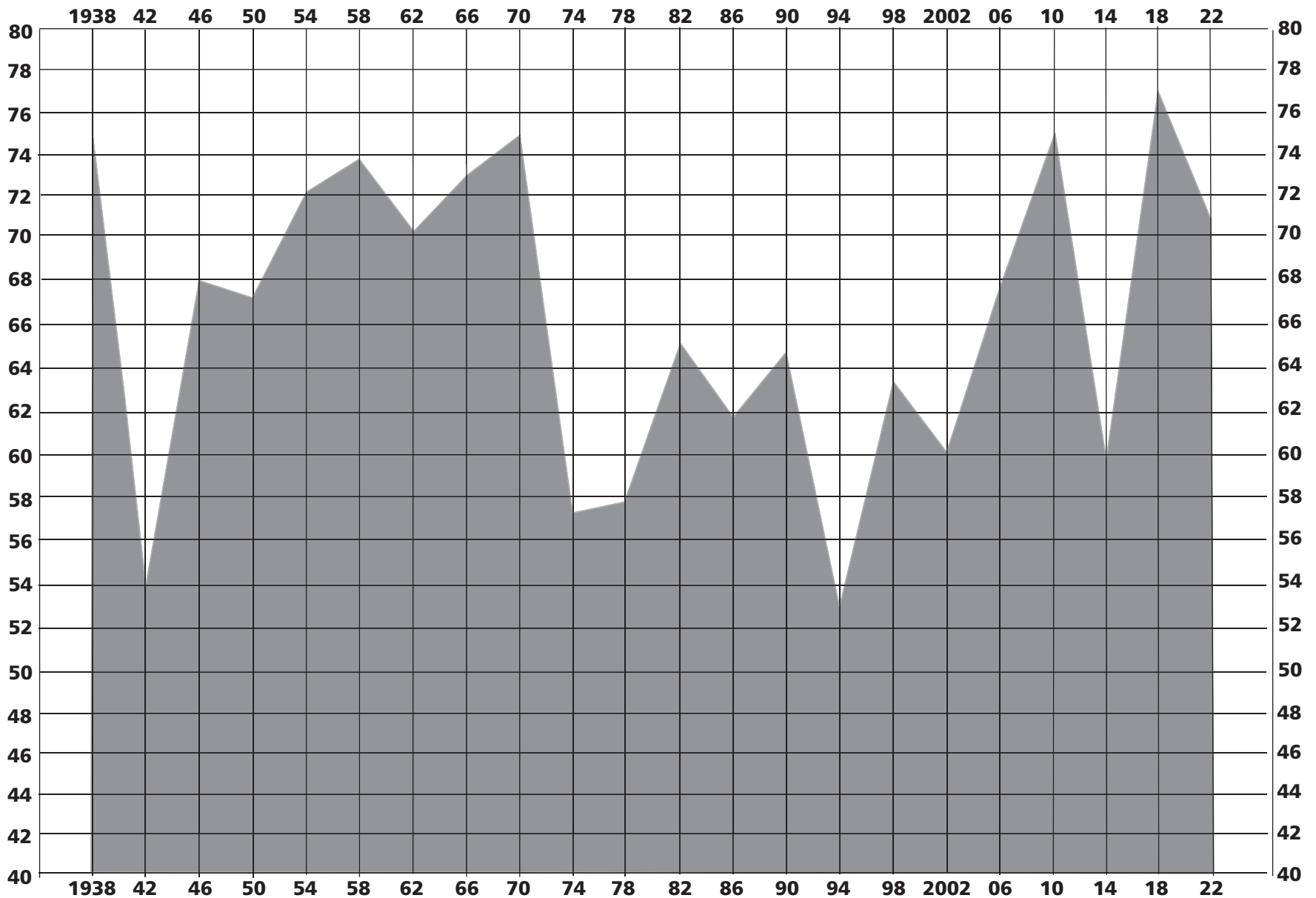

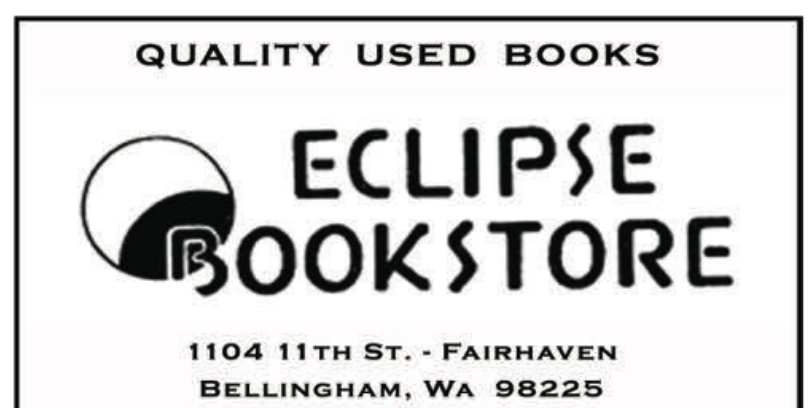

Return Envelopes Challenged

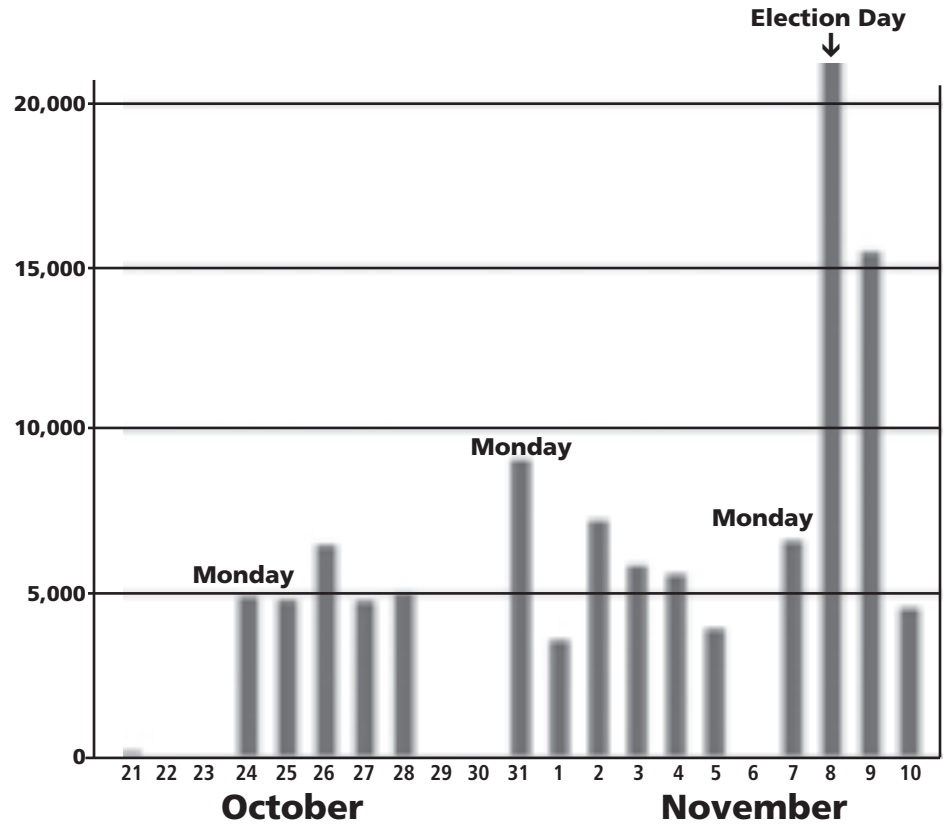

Daily Envelope Returns

The Whatcom County auditor's office mailed 157,683 ballots to registered voters; 1,431 were undeliverable. Over half of the ballots — 67,953 or 60.78 percent — were returned before election day. Envelopes challenged accounted for less than one percent of ballots returned.

Ranked Choice Voting

The following issues of *Whatcom Watch* contained articles about Ranked Choice Voting, October/November 2018, July 2019, September 2020 and October/November 2021. Ranked Choice Voting appeared on the 2022 general election ballot in six cities and was approved in all of them. It was on the ballot in three counties and was defeated in two, both are in Washington state.

Nevada

A second approval vote is required in 2024 to place Ranked Choice Voting in the Nevada Constiution.
